### **Ray David Reisig**

September 1, 1948 – February 7, 2025

Ray David Reisig was born in Portland, Oregon to David Henry Reisig and Evelyn Alta (Hall) Reisig and received the Sacrament of Holy Baptism at Second German Congregational Church. Ray and family later transferred to St. Michael's Lutheran Church where Ray was also confirmed.

Ray attended Concordia High School in Portland, playing baseball, basketball and football. He continued at Concordia Junior College, again playing football and baseball, and he also began to enjoy dancing, performance and storytelling. The senior college years took Ray to Concordia Teacher's College, Seward, Nebraska, to major in Elementary Education. His college football career ended due to a broken wrist, but led him to develop a championship intramural flag football team.

After graduation in 1970, Ray began his Lutheran ministry as teacher and coach at St. Peter's Lutheran School, Fort Wayne, IN. During this time Ray developed his classroom and coaching skills, especially watching and learning "Indiana basketball". Ray moved back to Portland, and in February of 1975, he began teaching at Trinity Lutheran School. Bringing Indiana basketball to Portland proved to be a winning combination for Lutheran grade school basketball, LEST, and culminated in a set of 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place trophies at the National LBAA Tournament at Valparaiso University, IN. In all, Coach Reisig compiled over 800<sup>th</sup> basketball wins. Ray retired from his teaching ministry in 2011.

As a coach, Ray developed assistant coaches and had a reputation as a friend and mentor. He spent his time maintaining the field and gymnasium, providing extra academic and athletic skill building, working with students to prepare for high school, college, and even professional athletics. As a faculty colleague, Ray loved to direct school plays, musicals and productions.

Beyond coaching and teaching, Ray had a lifelong hobby of model railroading, collecting and running various train sets. Ray has always been a performer, enjoying jokes, storytelling, making up dances, and writing, producing, directing, and starring in his own home movies. Ray's love of dancing led him to the love of his life Cathy Jakes and they

were married on April 26, 2014 at Trinity. Dancing continued to be part of their life together.

Ray is survived by his wife Cathy, sister Gwen E. Maddalena, Emmett, ID, brother John H. Reisig (Janice) Houston, TX, brother Robert L. Reisig (Michelle) Kent, WA, sister-In-law Karen Snow (Jerry) Portland, OR, and nephews and nieces Jenny Cammack (Michael), Julie Yancey (Dino), Jodi Baldys (Matt), John D. Reisig (Shannon), Alex Reisig, Teagan Reisig, Lucas Reisig, and Anna Prosser (Nate) and Jake Prosser (Melissa). Ray was preceded in entry to Heaven by his parents, mother-In-Law Phyllis Jakes, and brother-In-law Bill Maddalena.
